Take this handy list to the store and be ready the next time power goes out.

35 Items that are First to Go in A Disaster

- 1. Bottled Water always flies off the shelf first.
- 2. **Canned Foods**. Don't forget a manual can opener! Concentrate on caloriedense options like chili, soups, (this is not the time to worry about unhealthy ingredients), canned meats and fish.
- 3. Any packaged, shelf stable food, including sweets and chips.
- 4. **Bread, Rice, Beans, Wheat, Flour and Yeast**. All these basic ingredients will be quickly depleted.
- 5. Charcoal and grills, portable grills, etc.
- 6. Cooking Oils will go fast. They can also be used to make oil lamps.
- 7. **Milk,** powdered, condensed, sweetened, you name it. Also, cream, coffee creamers, eggs, and cheese.
- 8. Protein powders, protein bars, granola bars.
- 9. Jerky and other long-lasting meats.
- 10. Teas, Coffee, Bottled drinks, powdered drinks.
- 11. Water Filters/Purifiers including bleach will be impossible to find after the first few days.
- 12. **Generators** will fly off the shelves. Buy one now because nothing will be available when it's most needed.
- 13. Flashlights, lanterns, and glowsticks. And don't forget the batteries or fuel.
- 14. **Candles, oil lamps.** For candles, get unscented and long burning. Also get fire extinguishers!
- 15. Plastic forks, knives, spoons, paper plates.

- 16. Plastic cups, hot cups.
- 17. **Hygiene supplies** such as shampoo, toothbrushes and toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, mouthwash, floss, etc
- 18. First aid kits
- 19. OTC meds. Tylenol, Advil, cold & flu, cough syrup.
- 20. Toilet Paper, Tissues, Paper Towels, Napkins
- 21. Vitamins and Herbal Supplements.
- 22. Cast iron frying pans and dutch ovens are long lasting and are made to be used over an open fire.

23. Infant/Toddler Supplies.

- 24. Insulated ice chests.
- 25. Bleach. Make sure you get plain, not scented: 4 to 6% sodium hypochlorite.Plain bleach can be used to purify drinking water if necessary.
- 26. **Garbage cans and bags** can be used for trash, storage, water collection, and lots of other things.
- 27. Cleaning and disinfecting supplies.
- 28. Aluminum foil, regular and heavy-duty.
- 29. Lighters, matches, flint and steel fire starters, fire pistons
- 30. Batteries Don't forget solar recharger stations.
- 31. **Canning supplies** including jars, lids, and pectin. Most stores do not carry large quantities of canning supplies so get these before they sell out!
- 32. **Wine/Liquors** can be used medicinally. Vodka is useful for making many herbal medicines.
- 33. All camping supplies.
- 34. Portable Toilets. Buckets and other containers.
- 35. Firearms, knives, axes and other tools.
